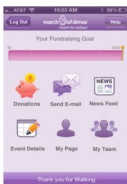
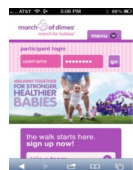

Roosevelt and Dr. Jonas Salk, who played key roles in the March of Dimes work to conquer polio. The coin's tail is the image of a baby being cuddled in the hand of her parent, illustrating the March of Dimes dedication to the health of babies everywhere.

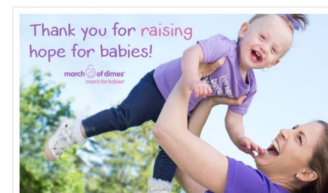

## brilliant minds come together to solve the mystery of premature birth

.....

The World Health Organization has declared premature birth to be the leading cause of newborn death for children under five years old. And the United States has one of the highest rates of preterm birth of any developed country. The March of Dimes mission has never been more urgent.

No one knows why babies are born too soon. With your support, March of Dimes has created four state of the art research centers dedicated solely to discovering the cause of premature birth. This great endeavor involves hundreds of scientists from every scientific discipline. We are looking at this urgent health crisis with 'team science' approach with traditional and non-traditional methods to one day soon find the cause or causes, and one day, a cure, for premature birth."

At **Stanford University**, researchers are studying whether women who deliver early have different genetic profiles or different micro-organisms living in their bodies. Using super-computers to analyze

millions of data points may soon make it possible to predict which women are most likely to go into early labor and develop effective treatment.

Scientists at the **Ohio Collaborative** are examining the role of race and genetics. While most black women have higher rates of premature birth, Somali women have very low rates. A new study aims to find out why.

The tools routinely used to measure your heartbeat may soon be applied to visualize the contractions of the uterus. Obstetricians at **Washington University in St. Louis** have joined with cardiologists and engineers to create a window into how and why contractions occur, and how they might be stopped if they occur too soon.

Researchers at the **University of Pennsylvania** are teaming up to measure the biomechanics of the cervix and its responses to increasing weight of the growing fetus. This scientific team will determine if problems with the cervix lead to preterm birth.

Thanks to your support, we have mobilized the largest, most focused team in the history of premature birth research. Together, we can deliver the answers that moms and their health care providers need to have healthy, full-term babies.
