### Annually in Texas:

- 399,766 babies are born.
- 41,345 babies are born preterm.
- 12,110 babies are born with a birth defect.
- Prematurity and birth defects are leading causes of infant mortality.
- 2,255 babies die before reaching their first birthday.
- The societal cost of premature birth is \$2.1 billion.

In the last year, the March of Dimes

- funded research grants totaling nearly \$24 million nationally
- invested \$635,000 in maternal and child health community grants in Texas

#### Prematurity Research Centers

At five centers around the United States, teams of brilliant minds from a wide range of disciplines are looking for answers and sharing discoveries. This will ultimately transform our understanding of the causes and preventions for premature birth.

#### NICU Family Support®

Provides comfort and information to families with a premature or critically ill baby who must spend time in a newborn intensive care unit (NICU).

#### Healthy Babies are Worth the Wait®

A March of Dimes initiative to encourage healthy, full-term births. Through education of women and health care providers, quality improvement activities with hospitals, and awareness activities, Healthy Babies are Worth the Wait helps reduce the number of non-medically necessary labor inductions and elective cesarean sections before 39 weeks gestation, and emphasizes that the last few weeks of pregnancy are key for an infant's development.
