TOUGH AS STEELE



Nineteen years after having their first child, Lisa and Todd Peverill were pregnant with their second.

However, this pregnancy had many complications. At 18 weeks, their baby

descended and required an **emergency surgery** to save his life. Then four weeks later, Lisa woke in the middle of the night in labor. **Their baby wouldn't survive at 22 weeks** and doctors weren't having success in stopping the labor. At some point, they were asked to make funeral arrangements. And then something happened. The contractions stopped, the pain was gone, and the baby's heart rate returned to normal.

New Year's marked **24 weeks—a viable baby!**

But that night, Lisa awoke realizing that she was hemorrhaging and her baby was flipping around.

They rushed to Fairfax Hospital and 10 days later, **Steele was born weighing 2 lbs 1 oz.** The next 91 days in the newborn intensive care unit (NICU) was physically and mentally straining, and an experience the family will never forget.

Today, you would never know he had less than a 10% to survive.
